
Macrame Keychains: University packs




Materials: 8X36Inches of pre-cut wool/cord, scissors, keychain ring, something to hold the keychain for tension.

First you need to loop the wool around the keychain ring, fold your wool in half, then pull the loop it through the ring. Pull this loop through the ring, so the loop end is over the ring and ends of the length. Pull these ends up through the loop, repeat 8 times.





Now decide which side you would like to start on, then pull this diagonally across the other strands. And create the loop knots over it (keeping both strands together), but keeping hold of it, work towards the middle (4th knot), then repeat on the opposite side. Next lay out the 8 knots and taking the four strands in the middle (4th and 5th knot), spread out the strands, then taking the outside one on either side make loop knots across the two inside strands, repeat twice, and on the opposite outer strand too.





We practiced a few times, but you can see the 'V' appearing. If any mistakes happen that's fine, it makes them more tactile (sensory bliss)!!



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Last step is to tie it off, I used two outer singular strands to loop knot the ends together, then wrapped and knotted with the other outer strand. And cut off excess.
